## **Dorsal Dynamics**

The dorsal aspect of the hand is unique. It is more prone to adhesions and contractures preventing functional use of the hand.

Paralysis of the extensor musculature renders the hand useless due to the lack



of extensor control required for placement of the hand to achieve required tasks.

Restoring the extensor mechanics to its normal functional lever requires a good understanding of anatomy and biomechanics along with the pathologies associated with it, followed by application of the correct treatment at the right time. Any delays in treatment could hinder function due to adhesions that cause stiffness or by over stretched muscles complicating the pathology.
